- a. **Open Access at Creekside Clinic**
 - i. **Mon. – Thur. – 8 -7 need to be here by 5**
 - ii. **Friday – 8 -6 – need to be here by 4**
- b. **Grants Pass Clinic – by appointment – 1 day a week**
- c. **Siskiyou Pediatric Clinic – by appointment – 1 day a week**
- d. **Two individual PCP offices – by appointment – 1 day every other week**
- e. **Scheduled appointments for youth newly in foster care**

- a. **In all public schools in Josephine County**
- b. **In Rogue River School District Schools**
- c. **Doing Medicaid services for clients with Mental Health Diagnosis**
- d. **In clinic hours for therapy**

C. Master’s Level Outreach therapists

- a. **GPHS**
- b. **IVHS**
- c. **Gladiola and GPass classrooms - 16 hours per week**
- d. **Rogue River District schools**

F. Skills trainers

- a. **In all Three Rivers elementary schools – 8 hours per week**
- b. **In all District 7 elementary and middle schools – 8 hours per week**

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- c. In 3 after school programs with District 7 elementary schools
 - d. In 2 after school programs with District 7 middle schools
 - e. In 1 behavioral classroom daily for 3 hours in Three Rivers Fruitdale Elementary
 - f. Individual skills training
 - g. Groups – DBTeen, 24/7 Dads, 1 2 3 Magic, emotional skills group, social skills group
- G. Peer Support
- a. 1 peer parent assigned to intensive level and wraparound level families
 - b. 2 peer specialists assigned to youth in those same programs
- H. Psychiatric services
- a. Child psychiatrist sees youth for medications
 - b. Psychiatric nurse practitioner also sees youth for medications
- I. ABA
- a. Program for children with verified autism diagnosis
 - b. Services offered in home by specially trained QMHA level staff
 - c. Psychologist
 - d. Behavior Specialist doing behavior plans
- J. FCC
- a. Program with DHS to reduce kids in foster care
 - b. Master's level family therapist
 - c. Parental skills trainer
 - d. Parent mentors
- K. YP1 meetings
- a. For multi-agency involved youth
 - b. Referrals from other agencies as well as from Options staff
 - c. Planning and staffing session for youth with severe behavioral issues
- L. Suicide Prevention Specialist
- a. Provides trainings throughout the community
 - b. Head Options Suicide Prevention Task Force
 - c. Works with schools to develop policies and trainings for students and staff
 - d. Works with community agencies to develop policies around suicide prevention
- M. Private /no insurance
- a. No one is turned away
 - b. Sliding scale for fees based on income and number of family members dependent on that income
 - c. Some services offered by Options (skills training, care coordination) will likely not be covered by private insurance
- N. Early childhood services
- a. One master's level clinician trained specifically in infant/toddler mental health
 - b. 4 Master's level clinicians trained in Parent Child Interactive Therapy
- O. DHS Child Welfare assessments
- a. Each child taken into foster care has an assessment within 60 days of placement
 - b. CANS is done at the time of intake for each child

c. CANS is done on an annual basis for some children

P. Crisis services

a. 24/7 provided by Options Crisis Team mostly at Three Rivers Hospital

b. Mobile Crisis team is available for intervention in the community

c. Crisis line is answered by a live person 24/7

d. 3 managers from Options are part of the Grants Pass Public Safety Crisis Negotiations Team which responds to situations involving hostages and/or barricaded subjects
